2.	Welcome and Introductions	Ms. Ulrich welcomed all attendees and asked for roll call of the committees.

6.	Reports, Discussion and Recommendations	<p>Mr. Padilla made a motion to approve the August 4, 2022, One-Stop Committee summary, seconded by Ms. Chavez-Lopez. Motion passed unanimously. Roll call vote was as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ms. Arias-Ward – Yes • Ms. Chavez-Lopez – Yes • Mr. Martinez – Yes • Mr. Padilla – Yes • Ms. Ulrich – Yes <p>Mr. Whitehead made a motion to approve the February 6, 2023, Special Monitoring/Performance Committee summary, seconded by Ms. Santillan. Motion passed unanimously. Roll call vote was as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mr. Salome – Yes • Ms. Santillan – Yes • Ms. Thomas-Herrera – Yes • Mr. Whitehead – Yes <p>One-Stop Recertification Application</p> <p>Ms. Arias-Ward made a motion to bring it to the floor, seconded by Ms. Chavez-Lopez.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ms. Juarez clarified that the recertification is actually an application that is certified through the Department of Workforce Solutions. She said that the committee needs to review the application. Ms. Juarez said that the Las Cruces office is the only comprehensive office in the region, and that office is the one that needs to be recertified. She also mentioned that she sought guidance from the Central office on this application and process. • Ms. Juarez reviewed the application with both committees. She did mention that the One Stop Operator lists Peter Martinez but that Giselle Palomares is currently serving as interim Operator. That will need to be amended before the application is submitted. Ms. Juarez also highlighted that the policies and procedures will be added to the application. • The application also shows how well the One Stop Operator serves the program participants. Ms. Juarez reported that cross-training is occurring that enables workers to share information from various programs with a participant. This encourages workers' awareness of the other programs. She also complimented the One Stop Operator on updating the Standard Operating Procedures and working on improving the customer flow process. • Ms. Juarez mentioned the community meetings that are conducted, as well as the organizations, partnerships, and surveys. She also highlighted the newsletter that the OSO publishes monthly. This newsletter highlights the feedback that comes from the surveys completed by participants and employers. • Ms. Juarez said that she wants to focus on how to get the word out about the Youth and Adults and the services. She encouraged the utilization of social media, email, and website postings. Ms. Juarez said that we have the Las Cruces comprehensive center, and in other parts of the region, there are access points for participants. She highlighted events and other accommodations for participants. • Mr. Salome asked about the infrastructure funding of the One-Stop center. Ms. Juarez responded that the infrastructure funding agreement comes from the Memorandum of Understanding and includes everything from janitorial services to operating and billing.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ms. Ulrich asked about the ratings that have been given to the One Stop Operator. She wondered if there could be a more qualitative response on how well the One-Stop integrates services. She would like the application to have more of an evaluative response rather than a quantitative list of accomplishments. She would like to know more about how the One-Stop serves the participants. Ms. Juarez reported that the surveys that contain that information will also be attached to the application. She said that more evaluative survey information can be incorporated and that she can elaborate on those components. Mr. Martinez offered to assist Ms. Juarez with locating the previous certification application for reference on what was done previously. Ms. Juarez continued to review the application. She highlighted the partnership with the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR). She mentioned that she will add more data about this partnership as well. Ms. Juarez reported improving ADA accessibility by adding a keyboard and mouse that assist disabilities. Ms. Santillan mentioned gratitude for the interpreters and additional aids for participant services. Ms. Ulrich praised the publication flyer for the career fair. She appreciated that it said interpreter services will be available for deaf and hard of hearing career seekers. Ms. Juarez continued with the continuous quality improvement section. She said that more data will be added to that section as well. Ms. Juarez reported that there is a focus on improving communication with partners. Ms. Ulrich reiterated that there needs to be more data showing evidence of the services given, and the quality of the services, to the participants. She would like more specific data shown to the board. Mr. Salome agreed. He also offered to assist with the application. He said that he felt that everything was well written and illustrated the information well. Mr. Whitehead pointed out the challenges that the 7 counties have due to the diversity of each county with their populations and locations. He said that the One Stop needs to be agile and adapt its services according to the areas they are serving. He also offered support to assist in getting the application submitted. Ms. Ulrich said the recommendation was a motion to approve the submittal of the recertification application. She said that there needs to be a recommendation to amend the motion. Mr. Whitehead pointed out that the approval of the application needs to be by the One-Stop Committee rather than both committees since it was previously reviewed and approved by the One-Stop Committee. Mr. Salome agreed. Ms. Juarez mentioned that Ms. Estrada (SAWDB Board Chair) has to sign off on the application as well before it is submitted. <p>Ms. Ulrich called for a motion to amend the motion to allow submittal of application upon review of the One Stop Committee Chair.. Ms. Arias-Ward made an amended motion to approve the application, seconded by Ms. Chavez-Lopez. Motion passed unanimously. She also presented the Adult & Dislocated Worker and Youth Obligations by county and by program.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mr. Whitehead asked about the recaptured state funds from the Youth Program. He asked about the specific expended funds for the Youth and what is obligated at this time. Ms. Juarez and Ms. Arnold explained that the funds returned to the State were not reflected in this presentation since they had not been finalized as of February 28; however, they will be reflected in the next report. Ms. Estrada asked about the number of participants that are included in the breakdown of the counties. Ms. Arnold reported that the total in-school and out-of-school youth is 46 participants across the counties. Ms. Estrada would like to see how many participants are in each county. Ms. Arnold will have Ms. Longovia send out the number of participants for each county. <p>Contract Indicators</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ms. Simms reported the Performance Indicators for the Adult and Dislocated Worker programs. She included the local board Goals and Actuals for Employment in PY22 Q3, as well as the Credential, Skill Gains, and Median Earnings. Mr. Salome asked requested a staffing update for New Mexico Workforce Connection in Socorro. Ms. Juarez reported it has been difficult to fill those positions. There is ongoing recruitment for that center. <p>Participant Summaries</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Detailed Participant Summary Reports were included in the packet. Because they are very detailed, Ms. Skinner reminded members that they can review them in their spare time. <p>Technical Assistance and Training</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ms. Simms presented the number of Technical Assistance sessions and hours provided to service provider staff from July 1, 2022, through March 31, 2023. Ms. Simms mentioned that the total number of Technical Assistance hours reported for the Alamo Youth was not correct. She said the correct hours are 24.25 hours of Technical Assistance. Ms. Simms stated that Ms. Molano hosted comprehensive training for the Youth staff. Mr. Whitehead requested another line reporting Technical Assistance Sessions and Hours broken down for the current quarter and asked for an emphasis on the Equus Youth Program training since there is a focus on solving the issues with participant enrollments. Ms. Simms clarified that Technical Assistance is not actual training but time and sessions spent helping staff correct system issues they cannot access. <p>Biannual Administrative Entity Monitoring Report</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> As requested by the AE Monitoring Review in April 2022, Ms. Juarez provided a biannual review of the Administrative Entity with the Monitoring Tool. She reported on each Deliverable listed within the tool and asked members to review this reporting process; if they'd like to continue with the in-depth annual report and shorter biannual reports. Ms. Skinner suggested the report be given once a year. After some discussion, members agreed an annual report would be sufficient. To reduce the number of pages in the annual review, Ms. Juarez suggested housing files on our website and providing the committee with links to view them. Ms. Juarez asked WIOA State Monitor Mr. Farkas, to share how they track and report their data. Mr. Farkas said there will be a week-long in-person

		monitoring session along with desk reviews. Then the team will issue a report with the findings. We can request they do a formal report to the board. Mr. Farkas added that the reporting mechanism is the report they issue.



July 1, 2022, - June 30, 2023










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WIOA Youth Participant Training Obligations by County
